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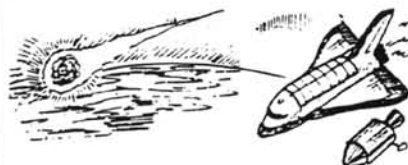

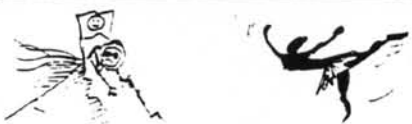
What **geographical feature** would you pass over, when travelling **between** each pair of cities?

- [10] asked, ★A/8

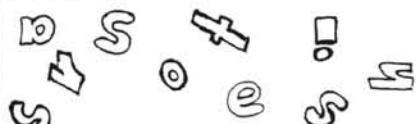
