



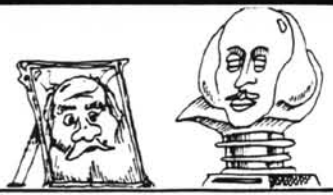

ALPHABET SKILLS



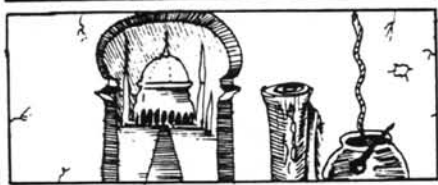

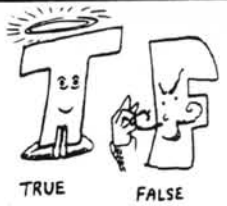
