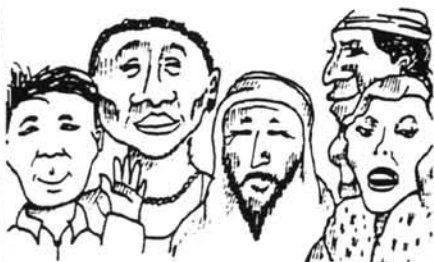

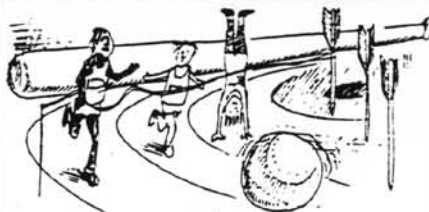

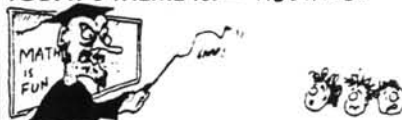


BRAIN-BENDER'S PURSUIT
